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1. Introduction

Colorado's Power Pathway (Pathway) is a \$1.7 billion investment proposed by Xcel Energy to improve the state's electric grid and enable future renewable energy development around the state. Pathway will increase electric reliability, boost the regional economy and create jobs during construction.

Colorado's Power Pathway will support Xcel Energy's Clean Energy Plan (Xcel Energy 2021) that is estimated to deliver as much as an 85 percent reduction in carbon dioxide emissions by 2030 and add approximately 5,000 megawatts of new wind, solar, and other resources. Pathway is a critical component to Xcel Energy's efforts to meet the state's statutorily required clean energy targets as well as Colorado's growing electricity needs. Pathway will also improve safety, reliability, and energy affordability.

This Neighborhood Outreach Meeting Summary includes a description of the public outreach approach, copies of the public notification materials, and the materials used during the Arapahoe County Neighborhood Outreach Meeting held on March 18, 2025. Section 1 of this summary provides an overview of Colorado's Power Pathway. Section 2 describes purpose of the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting, the target audiences and stakeholder notifications. Section 3 covers the approach of the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting.

1.1 Colorado's Power Pathway Overview

Colorado's Power Pathway will include the installation of approximately 550 miles of new 345-kilovolt (kV) double-circuit transmission lines and will be constructed in five segments:

- Fort St. Vrain — Canal Crossing (Segment 1)
- Canal Crossing — Goose Creek (Segment 2)
- Goose Creek — May Valley (Segment 3)
- May Valley — Sandstone — Tundra (Segment 4)
- Sandstone — Harvest Mile (Segment 5)

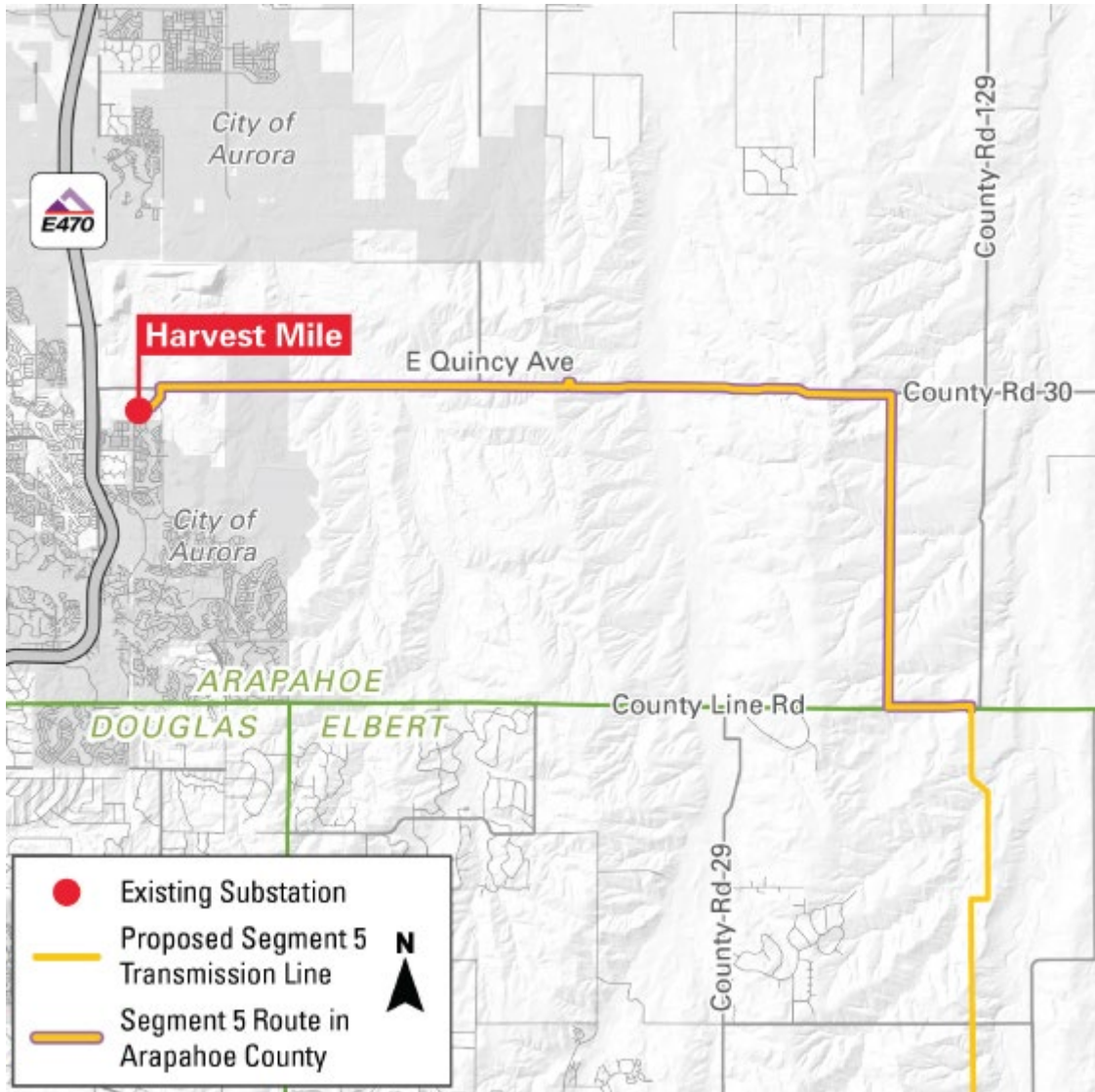


Figure 1: Segment 5 Transmission Route in Arapahoe County

Colorado's Power Pathway facilities proposed in unincorporated Arapahoe County include 17 miles of new 345-kV double-circuit electric transmission line and equipment additions within the existing fence line at Harvest Mile Substation (see Figure 1). No new land acquisition is required for the substation equipment additions. Proposed activities in Arapahoe County will also include seeking approval of all temporary construction areas associated with construction of the Pathway facilities for the duration needed to complete Pathway construction, including a laydown yard. Pathway facilities within Arapahoe County are anticipated to be placed in-service by 2027. The proposed route begins in Arapahoe County at the existing Harvest Mile Substation, located west of South Harvest Mile Road and East Quincy Avenue. The route proceeds northwest to East Quincy Avenue and proceeds east along East Quincy Avenue for approximately 11.5 miles (a portion of East Quincy Avenue is located in City of Aurora jurisdiction). Approximately 1.5 miles west of Brick Center Road (County Road 129), the proposed route turns south and proceeds due south for 5 miles to County Line Road (County Road 194). The route turns to the east and proceeds along County Line Road (County Road 194) for approximately 1.25 miles then turns south and crosses into Elbert County.

2. Neighborhood Outreach Meeting Overview

Pursuant to Section 5-2.1.2 of the Arapahoe County Land Development Code (Arapahoe County 2024) and Part 7 of the Arapahoe County Development Application Manual (Arapahoe County 2019), a Neighborhood Outreach Meeting was hosted on March 18, 2025, to answer any community concerns about the proposal and to solicit community input from neighboring and affected property owners and homeowners' associations in the vicinity of the transmission line route in Arapahoe County. This section provides an overview of outreach prior to the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting and Neighborhood Outreach Meeting notifications.

2.1 Project Communication Channels

Project-specific communication channels including a website, email address, and information line provided stakeholders opportunities to obtain information about Colorado's Power Pathway and communicate with Colorado's Power Pathway team members. The communication channels were launched in spring 2021 and continue to be monitored (Table 1).

Comment form submittals are checked each business day, tracked in a correspondence log and are typically responded to within 1 to 3 business days.

The inbox is monitored each business day, and all messages are added to a correspondence log. Emails that request follow-up are typically responded to within 1 to 3 business days.
Information Line	855-858-9037 The information line is accessible 24/7 and has a recorded message that provides up-to-date information on Colorado's Power Pathway activities. The information line is not staffed, but messages are checked each business day and transcribed in a correspondence log. Voicemails that request follow-up are typically responded to within 1 to 3 business days.

2.2 Neighborhood Outreach Meeting Notifications

Several communication methods were used to notify stakeholders about the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting as summarized in Table 2. Materials distributed to stakeholders included a brief project overview, Neighborhood Outreach Meeting information and ways to contact the Colorado's Power Pathway team. Formatting of Neighborhood Outreach materials followed Arapahoe County permitting requirements. Copies of the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting notifications and affidavits required by Arapahoe County are provided in the appendices as listed in Table 2.

The mailing affidavit confirms that all property owners and HOAs within the noticing radius were mailed the notice letters regarding the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting. The mailing affidavit was completed and notarized on February 28, 2025. This affidavit was provided to Arapahoe County on March 17, 2025, one day prior to the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting, per Arapahoe County notification requirements. 3. Neighborhood Outreach Meeting

The Neighborhood Outreach Meeting provided an in-person platform for people to learn about Colorado's Power Pathway in Arapahoe County and speak with project team members. A total of 7 people attended the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting held on March 18, 2025, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Arapahoe County Fairgrounds at 25690 East Quincy Avenue, Aurora, Colorado 80016.

Public outreach materials presented at the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting included five stations (see Table 3), directional signage to direct guests to the open house and various materials placed around the room for attendees to visit at their own pace.

Station	Description
Sign-In	Attendees were greeted and asked to sign in upon their arrival. Attendee name, organization, mailing address, phone number, and email address were collected. Attendees could also opt-in to the Colorado’s Power Pathway email list and were asked how they heard about the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting.
Sheet Maps	48-inch-by-36-inch sheet maps showing the proposed transmission line route and substation site in Arapahoe County were displayed on tables.
Display Boards	10 informational boards were displayed around the meeting space for attendees to review and ask questions of project staff.
Comments	A comment form was available for attendees to fill out and place in a submittal box. Attendees could also take the comment form home and mail it being postmarked by March 21, 2025.
Refreshments	Refreshments including water and light snacks were provided.

Information boards and fact sheets were available on the Colorado’s Power Pathway website for those who were unable to attend the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting. Public outreach materials presented at the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting are described in Table 4 and included in the appendices as listed in Table 4.

3.1 Public Comments and Responses to Comments

During the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting, Project representatives answered questions and discussed various topics related to Pathway with meeting attendees using the information boards and sheet maps presented. A paper comment form was distributed at the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting for attendees to fill out and place in a submittal box. Attendees could also take the comment form home and mail it by March 21, 2025. One comment form was submitted during the formal comment period and was received at the Neighborhood Outreach Meeting. The comment states “Very well done, I appreciate the experts they had on hand to answer all the questions, great to see the private sector working so proactively to get information about the future expansion and need for Colorado. Thank you!”. Xcel Energy acknowledges this comment. A copy of this comment is provided in Attachment C-3.

3.2 Next Steps

3.2.1 Ongoing Communications

Community engagement will continue through the maintenance of the communication channels outlined in Table 6 during the permitting and construction phases.

Please be advised that Xcel Energy (applicant) has had a pre-submittal meeting with Arapahoe County for a 1041/Location & Extent for Colorado's Power Pathway. Colorado's Power Pathway is being permitted concurrently through Arapahoe County's Regulations Governing Areas and Activities of State Interest (1041 Permit) process. Xcel Energy has submitted a 1041 Permit Application that provides more information about the aspects of the Project.

Colorado's Power Pathway is a \$1.7 billion investment to improve the state's electric grid and enable future renewable energy development around the state. Colorado's Power Pathway will increase electric reliability, boost the regional economy and create jobs during construction.

Colorado's Power Pathway facilities proposed in Arapahoe County include approximately 17 miles of 345-kilovolt double-circuit transmission line and equipment additions within the existing fence line at Harvest Mile Substation. The transmission line will include the installation of steel monopoles of varying heights and conductor wire strung between each pole between substations. As mentioned above, the transmission line segment is currently in the permitting phase at Arapahoe County and is anticipated to be in-service by 2027.

The transmission line route in Arapahoe County begins at the existing Harvest Mile Substation, located west of South Harvest Road and East Quincy Avenue. The route continues northwest to East Quincy Avenue and then east along East Quincy Avenue. The route turns south (between Tom Bay Road and County Road 129) and continues south to County Line Road. The route continues to the east along County Line Road (County Road 194) before crossing south into Elbert County.

Please reference the map included in this mailing or view the interactive map of the route at ColoradosPowerPathway.com.

The process the 1041/ Location & Extent will follow includes intake by Arapahoe County of Xcel Energy's 1041/ Location & Extent application, followed by County review and outside referral. The application will be reviewed by the Arapahoe County Planning Commission during a public hearing.

**Appendix A-2:
Mailing Affidavit**

Instructions for Mail Notification

Pursuant to Section 5-2.1.B.2 of the Land Development Code, mail notification is required for land development procedures requiring neighborhood outreach. Applicants must mail, First Class, a Notice of neighborhood outreach to the Owner(s) of Record, at the time of the outreach, of property located within a 500 foot radius of the proposed location. The Planning Division may expand or contract the notification boundary as appropriate to ensure adequate notice and that the nearest neighbors are notified. **The Notice shall be mailed no later than fifteen (15) days prior to neighborhood outreach.** Instructions for preparing the mail notification are as follows:

- Provide a list of surrounding property owners, HOAs, and neighborhood groups. As part of the list title, include the case number, the name of the proposal, and type of application being requested. The list of property owners must include two sets of information: First, include the full name and mailing address for each surrounding property owner. Second, provide the Assessor's Schedule Number representing each property owner's parcel of ground. This information can be obtained from the Arapahoe County Assessor's Office or the County's online mapping system: <https://gis.arapahoe.gov/ArapaMAP/>.
- Acquire a copy of the County Assessor's Map(s) which depicts the subject property (copies can be purchased in the Mapping Division or you can use the online mapping system). Graphically highlight all parcels of ground that will receive mail notification. Include a copy of this map, no larger than 11" x 17" in size, when you submit the mailing list.

Staff will send you the general template for the letter notifying surrounding property owners. Add specific information about your project to the letter template and send the draft letter to staff for review before mailing the notices. Submit a signed copy of the mailed letter to our Department on the first business day before the neighborhood meeting. Attach to the letter, the following notarized certification

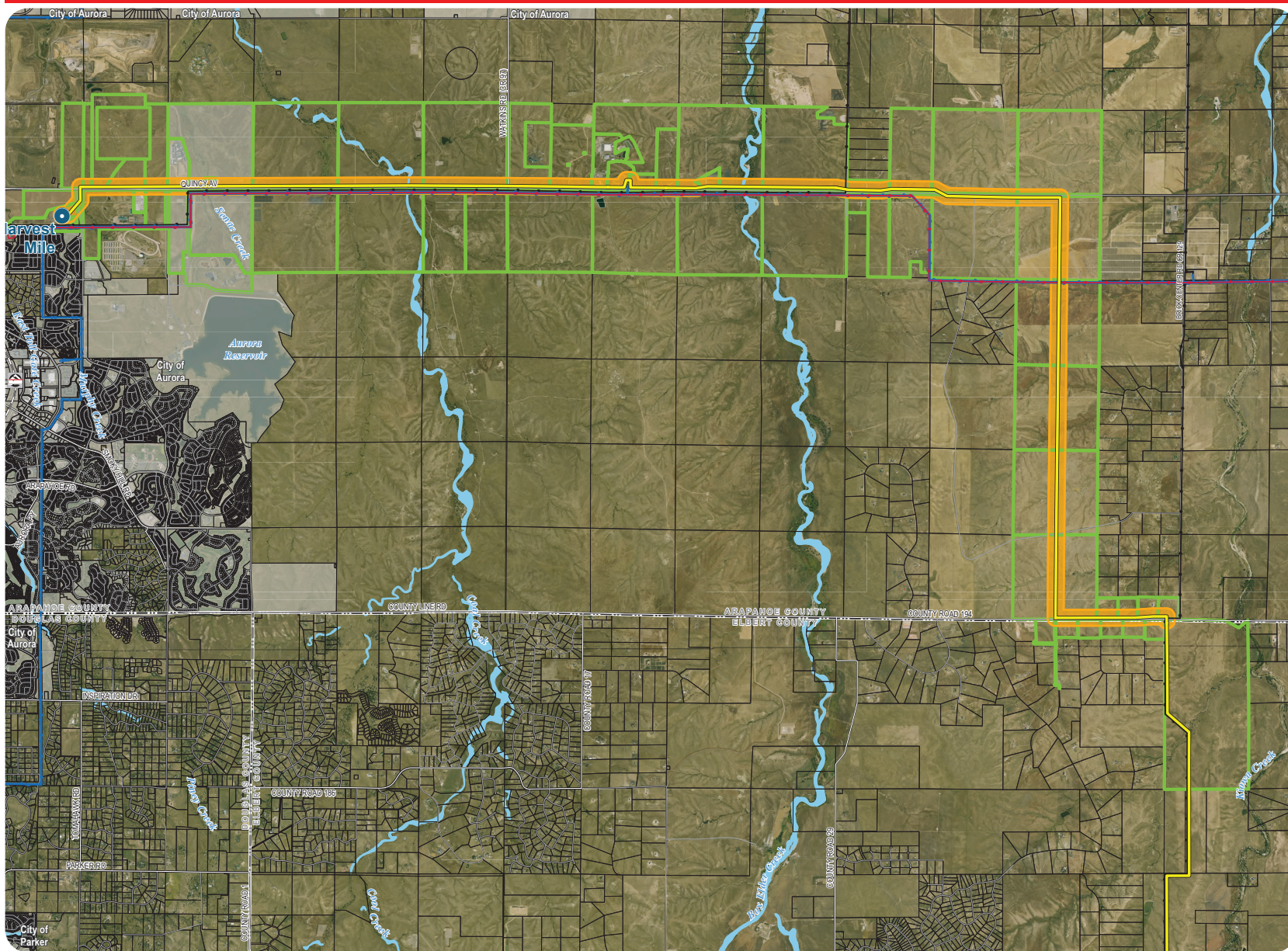

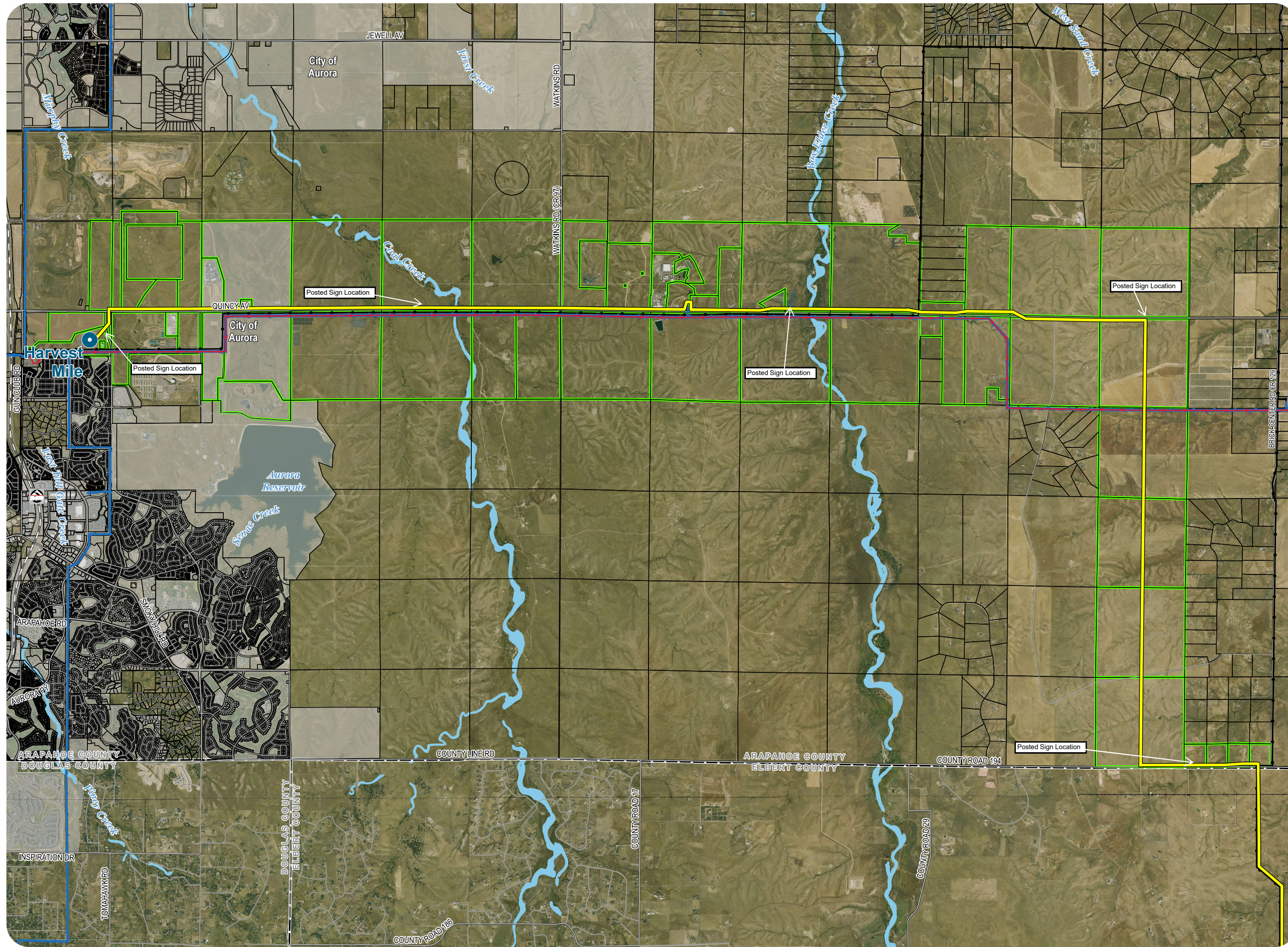

Overview Map

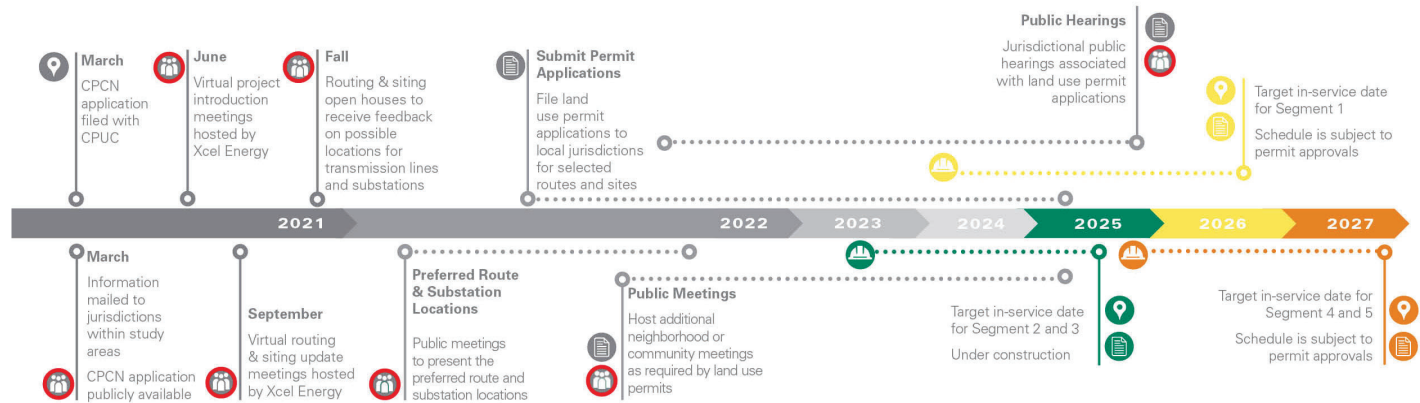

Segments 2 and 3 are anticipated to be in-service in 2025, Segment 1 is anticipated to be in-service in 2026 and Segments 4 and 5 in 2027.



BENEFITS



Colorado's Power Pathway supports the state-mandated goal of an 80% reduction in carbon emissions by 2030, which all electric utilities are required to comply with. Because Colorado's open transmission system carries electricity generated by multiple utilities that is distributed to homes and businesses by local power companies, both electric utilities and electricity users around the state benefit from this Project.

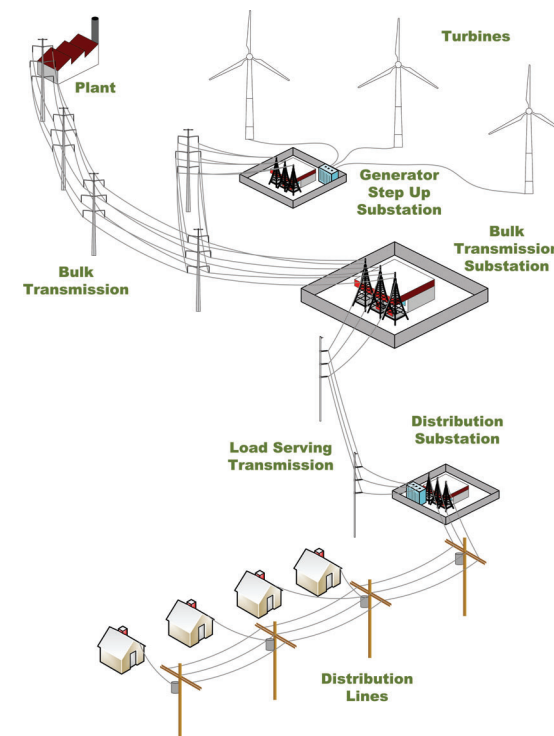

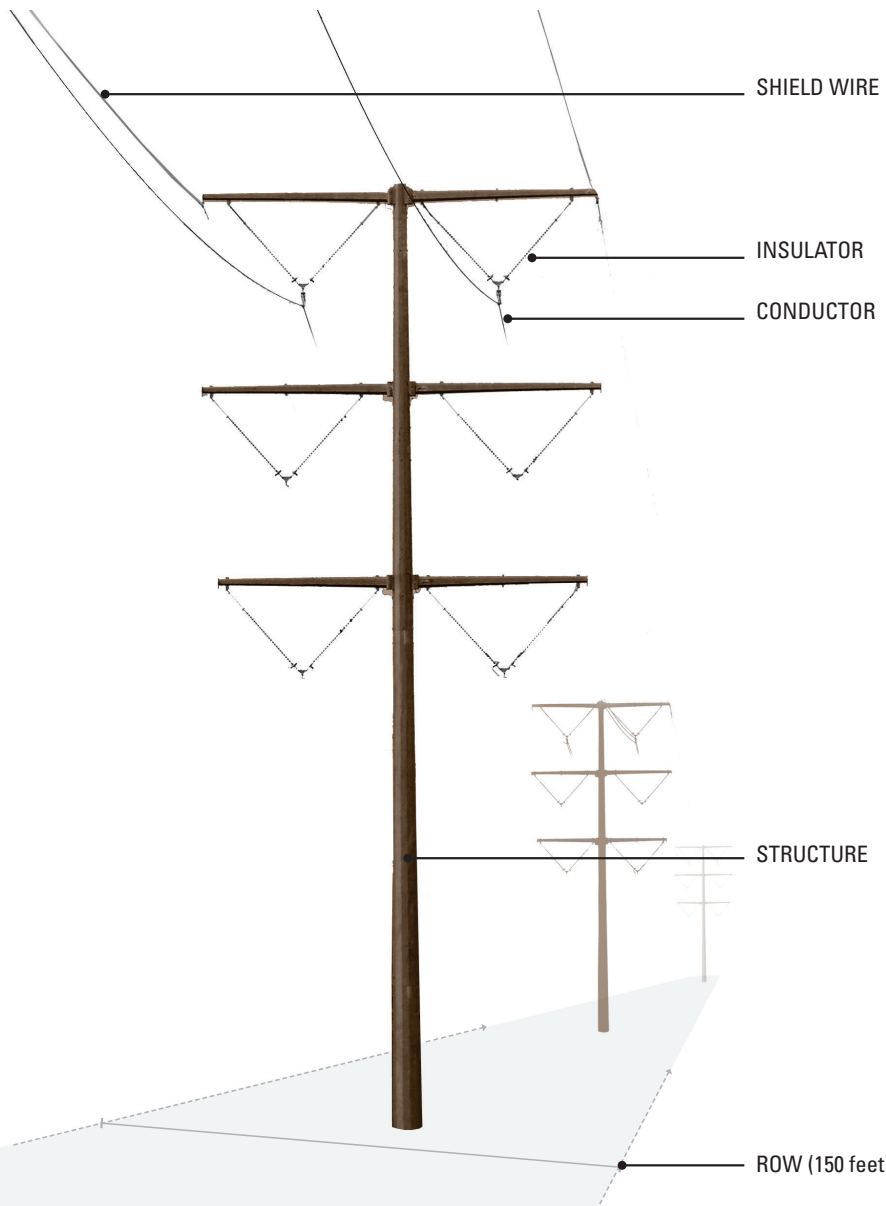

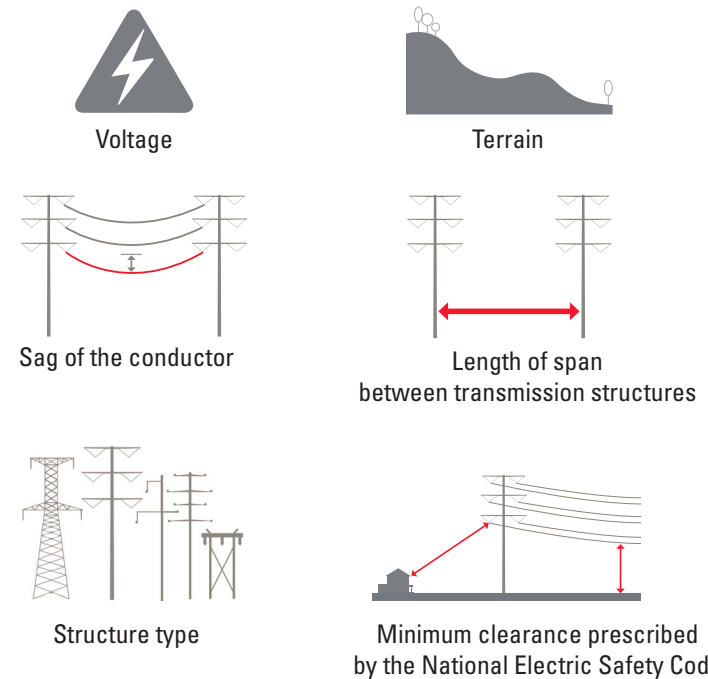
TRANSMISSION LINE



Anticipated Design

- Steel double-circuit transmission structure
- Single pole for most structures, two poles for certain high-loading structures
- Each pole will be on a concrete foundation
- Typical poles range 105 to 140 feet above ground
- 150-foot-wide Right-of-Way
- Typical span length of 950 feet between transmission structures
- Weathering steel or galvanized grey color

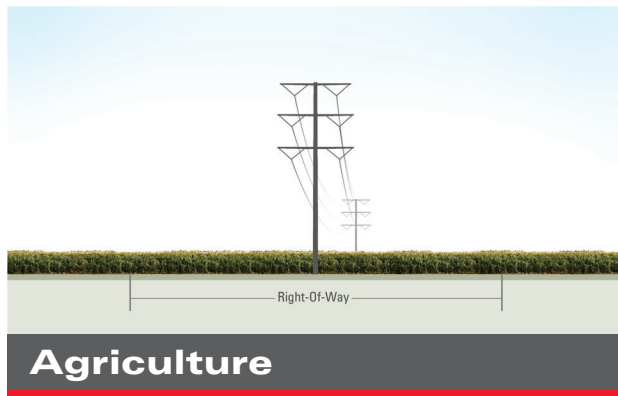
WORKING WITH LANDOWNERS

EASEMENTS are a permanent right authorizing a utility to use the Right-of-Way (ROW) to build and maintain a transmission line.

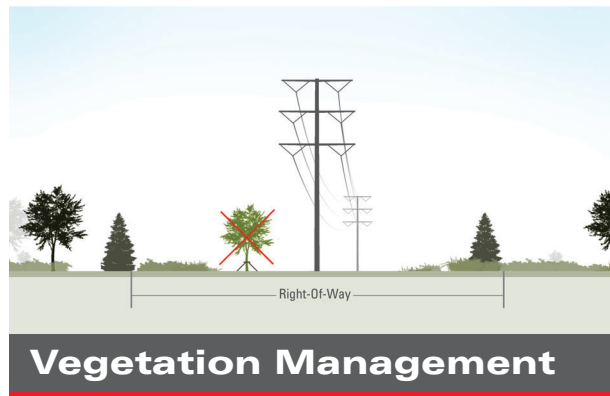
Landowners are paid a fair market value for the easement and can continue to use the land so long as their use does not interfere with the operation and maintenance of the transmission line.

RIGHTS-OF-WAY are the actual land areas acquired for a specific purpose such as a transmission line, roadway or other infrastructure.

Allowed Uses within Easements

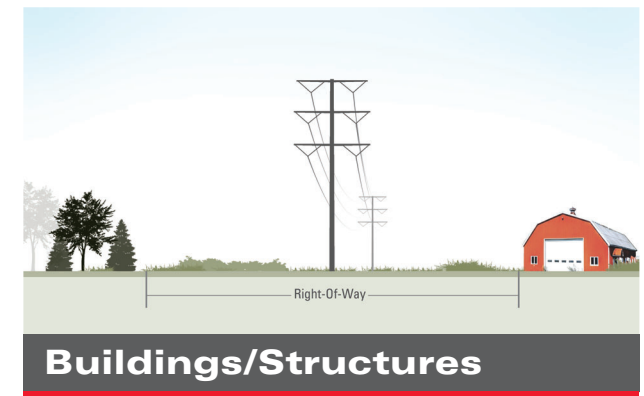


After initial construction of the utility infrastructure, agricultural activities can continue outside of the small area occupied by the transmission structures.



Trees growing near power lines can be a safety hazard and are a major contributor to electric service interruptions nationwide. There may be some areas where tree removal and pruning will be needed.

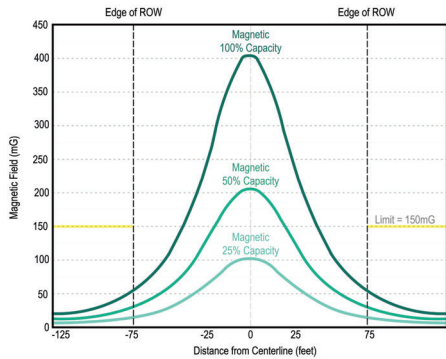
Tree pruning is the selective removal of branches that are not an adequate distance away from power lines, or that will grow too close to the power line before the next maintenance cycle. Our goal is to provide safe, reliable electric service while also taking the best possible care of one of your community's valuable natural resources.



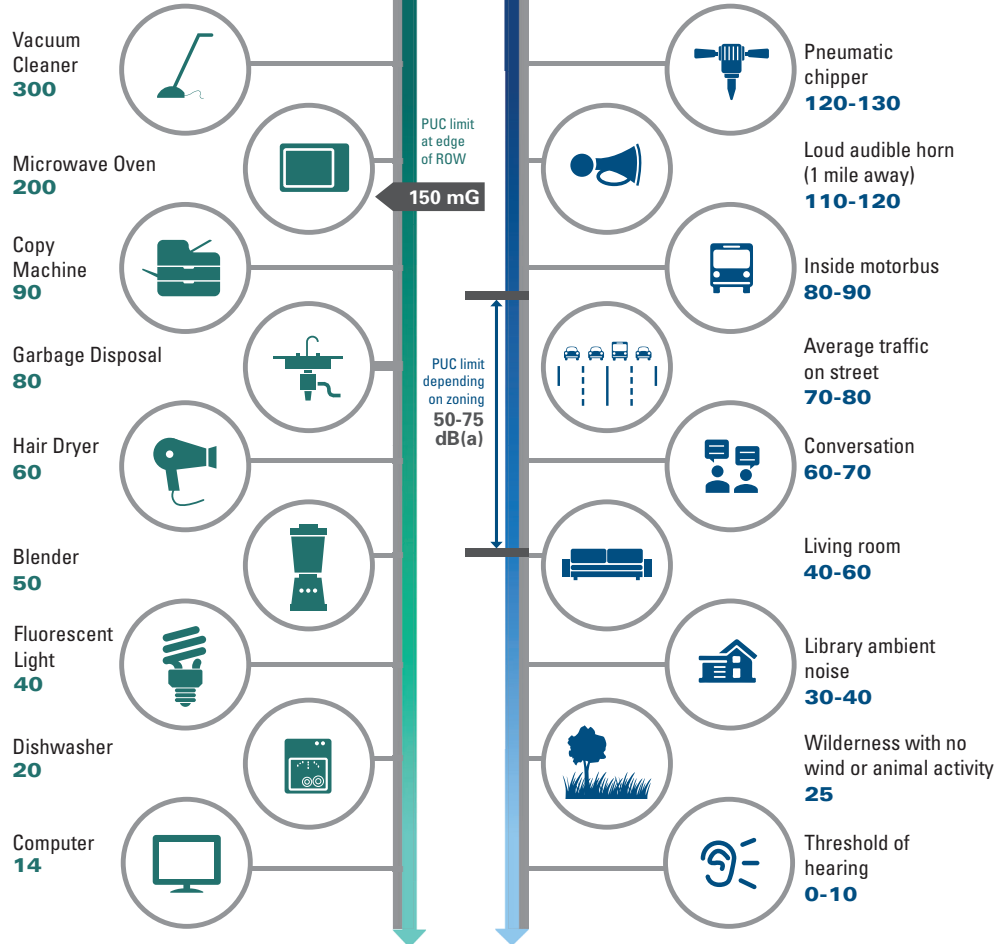
Generally, buildings or other structures are not allowed in the Right-of-Way/easement for transmission lines due to clearance and safety concerns. Landowners can only build structures under a power line after receiving written approval from the electric utility.

MAGNETIC FIELDS AND NOISE

MAGNETIC FIELDS

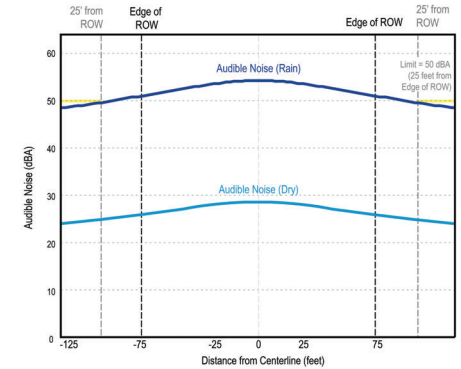


Typical magnetic fields six inches from common home appliances measured in milliGauss (mG) are depicted in the chart below.



The chart below provides typical noise levels encountered in common settings measured in decibels [dB(a)]

AUDIBLE NOISE



MAGNETIC FIELDS, measured in milliGauss (mG), are produced by electric current and only exist when an electric appliance is turned on – the higher the current, the greater the magnetic field. As with electric fields, the strength of a magnetic field dissipates rapidly as you move away from its source.

The power line serving your neighborhood produces EMF just like household appliances such as your toaster, hair dryer, lamps and washing machine. Business equipment, such as computers, copiers and fluorescent lights, also produce EMF.

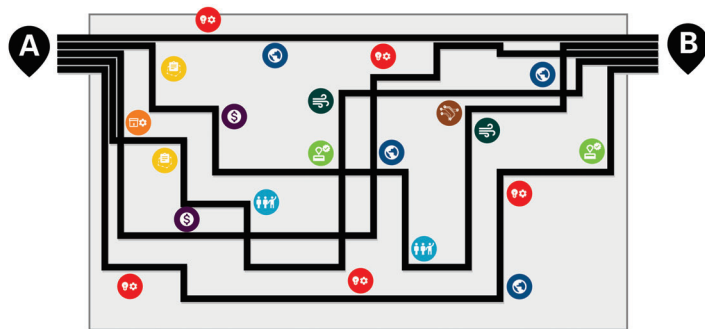
CORONA is a phenomenon associated with all transmission lines. Corona is a small electrical discharge, not unlike the static electrical charge that a person may experience when touching a metal object when walking on carpet. Corona is what creates the hissing or crackling sound that often emanates from transmission lines. Corona increases substantially in wet weather, when water droplets form on a transmission line which increase the corona (and increase audible noise).

SITE AND ROUTE SELECTION

Xcel Energy uses an open and comprehensive process to evaluate and select transmission line routes and substation sites that considers electric system planning, project costs, the environment, public involvement, regulatory compliance, existing and planned land use, land rights and system engineering.



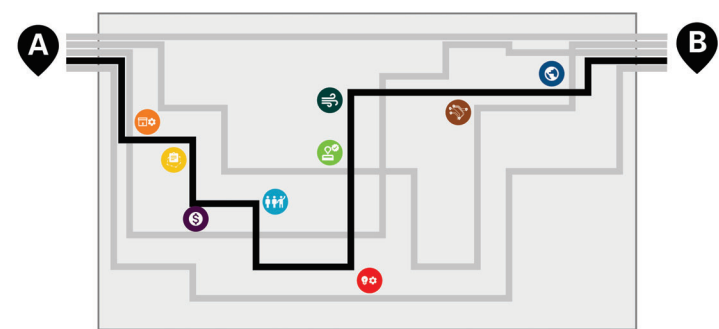

Alternative Routes



Identifying the location for the new transmission line segments is accomplished through a process that includes engaging the public, landowners and other stakeholders. Cultural and historic resources, technical and engineering requirements, environmental constraints, existing and planned land use and other factors that people have told use are important to consider are evaluated and compared for transmission line route options. The final route proposed in the local land use permitting processes will balance all these factors.

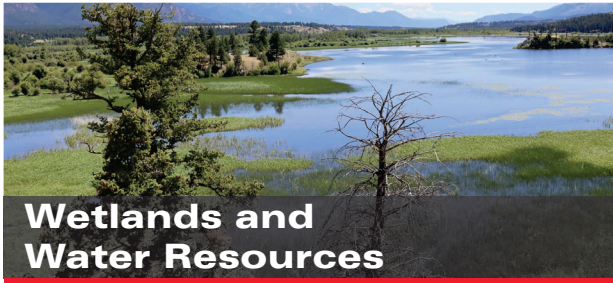

WILDLIFE AND WETLANDS



Xcel Energy shares the interest of our customers and the communities we serve in promoting clean energy and protecting the environment. Sensitive natural resources are considered in identifying the locations for the substations and transmission lines to minimize potential impacts.



Wetlands and Water Resources

Impacts to wetlands will be avoided or minimized by careful placement of the substations and transmission lines.

We attempt to site transmission structures in locations that will avoid conflicts with irrigation equipment and its operation to the extent possible.

Impacts to rivers and streams will be avoided or minimized by placing transmission structures outside the waterway and spanning where possible.



Birds and Wildlife

Locations of known habitat are mapped and avoided where possible.

Conservation easements, national wildlife refuges and state wildlife areas will be avoided to the extent possible.

Seasonal restrictions are implemented to avoid constructing near habitat during certain seasons (such as nesting) as recommended by Colorado Parks and Wildlife and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service guidance.

Electrical components of the transmission lines and substations will be separated to minimize the risk of avian contact. Bird diversion devices will be installed where necessary.



Agency Coordination and Regulatory Compliance

Xcel Energy filed an application with the Colorado Public Utilities Commission in March 2021 (Proceeding Number: 21A-0096E).

Xcel Energy will coordinate with wildlife agency representatives regarding the proposed project throughout planning, design and construction and will comply with all regulatory requirements.

Local land use and construction permits will be obtained in the jurisdictions crossed and include:

- 1041, Use by Review, Land Use Change, Special Use Review, Major Land Use Permits
- Right-of-Way Use, Road Use Agreements, Access, Transport, Grading, Stormwater
