



**ARAPAHOE COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD
DECEMBER 18, 2025 3:00 PM
HYBRID MEETING**

The Chair called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. He welcomed members and guests. Board and staff member introductions were made.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: The December 18, 2025 Agenda was APPROVED with no changes.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The November 20, 2025 Minutes were APPROVED as sent out in the packets.

FULL BOARD REFERRALS:

Phillip Albritton – Transition. Charges: Attempted First Degree Assault (F4), Menacing (F5). The Victim’s Grandfather (see names listed under attendance) was present to answer any questions from the Board and gave a statement for the Board. Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 7 YES and 2 NO.

Taylor Dagoon – Transition. Charges: Sexual Exploitation of a Child (F3). The Offender’s Father (see names listed under attendance) was present to answer any questions from the Board. Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was DENIED UNANIMOUSLY with 9 NO.

Angelo Montoya – Transition. Charges: Attempted First Degree Murder (F2), Accessory to Crime Charged with Class One or Two (F4), Manslaughter (F4), Criminally Negligent Homicide (F5). The Offender’s Brother and Offender’s Wife (see names listed under attendance) were present to answer any questions from the Board. Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 7 YES and 2 NO.

Ziyad Ammar – Charges: Accessory to Crime Charged with Class One or Two (F4), Possession of Financial Transaction Device (F5). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 8 YES and 1 NO.

Gilberto Cruz – Transition. Charges: Attempted Second Degree Kidnapping (F4), Attempted Second Degree Assault (F5). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was DENIED with 2 YES and 7 NO.

Jared Jimenez – Transition. Charges: Child Abuse Cause Death (F2). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was DENIED with 1 YES and 8 NO.

Jose Madrid – Transition. Charges: Robbery from At Risk (F3), First Degree Burglary (F3), Theft from At Risk (F5). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. Bailey made the motion for ARCHES only, and Feist did not object. The motion was APPROVED with 5 YES and 4 NO.

Sabrina Oglesby – Transition. Charges: Attempted First Degree Assault (F4). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 7 YES and 2 NO.

Ely Ryszkowski – Transition. Charges: Attempted First Degree Assault (F4), Second Degree Burglary of a Building (F4). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 6 YES and 3 NO.

Kenneth Stanley – Transition. Charges: Sexual Exploitation of a Child (F3), Sexual Exploitation of a Child (F3). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was DENIED with 3 YES and 6 NO.

Charles Waters – Transition. Charges: First Degree Assault (F3). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was APPROVED with 8 YES and 1 NO.

Dana Wescott – Transition. Charges: Sexual Exploitation of a Child (F4). Feist made the standard motion for acceptance into community corrections, and it was seconded by Bailey. The motion was DENIED with 1 YES and 8 NO.

VENDOR REPORTS:

Kamby stated that the CCTC Key Performance Indicators Proposal was emailed to the Board. Programs have the opportunity to receive an enhanced per diem if they set and meet certain goals. This is done on a three year cycle and this is a calendar year for CCTC to submit goals. The initial plan was emailed to the Board and requires the Board's approval. The proposal was APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY with 9 YES.

ACTC: Longstrom was present to answer any questions from the Board. Average Daily Population was 48 Diversion, 43 Transition and 26 Non-Residential. Admissions included: 4 Diversion and 3 Transition. Discharges included: 1 Transfer to Probation, 2 Parole, 1 Non-Residential, 1 Regression, and 4 Escapes. Non-Residential Discharges included 2 Sentence Discharges, 1 Sentence Reconsideration, and 1 Revocation.

ACRC: Phebus was present to answer any questions from the Board. Average Daily Population was 50 Diversion, 85 Transition (including 1 Condition of Parole), and 24 Non-Residential. Admissions included: 4 Diversion and 10 Transition. Discharges included: 2 Sentence Discharges, 5 Parole, 2 Reject After Accept, 3 ISP, 2 Revocation, 2 Escapes, and 1 IRT. There were no Non-Residential Discharges for the month.

CCTC: Gillespie was present to answer any questions from the Board. Average Daily Population was 29 Diversion, 54 Transitions, and 28 Non-Residential. Admissions included: 3 Diversion, and 8 Transition. Discharges included: 1 Sentence Discharge, 2 Parole, 3 Non-Residential, 1 Reject After Accept, 2 Escape, and 1 ISP. Non-Residential Discharges included: 1 Sentence Discharges and 1 Return to Residential.

DOC Report: Everingham was present to answer any questions from the Board. There were no questions from the Board.

MISSION

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FINANCIAL REPORT/BUDGET REVIEW: Kamby stated that the financial report was emailed to the Board. Spending for November was at \$673,201.05. Diversion Residential spending was at 86%, Diversion Non-Residential spending was at 114%, Transition spending was at 130%, Condition of Parole spending was at 75%, and HB1352 spending was at 112%, for a total of 101%. The Average Daily Population was 107 for Diversion and 188 for Transition. The Average Daily Population for the programs was as follows: ACTC – 92, ACRC – 126, CCTC – 76, and Out of County – 1.

HB1352 spending for November was \$16,984.00.

CORRESPONDENCE AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Kamby stated that Dr. Casper and Dr. Lyons' Board terms will expire in January so their last meetings will be in January. If they are able to attend in person, there will be a celebration for them.

Kamby stated that there was a discussion at the Board Training Conference in September to use the Judicial Services Community Service Program to provide some basic items for individuals entering the Community Corrections programs either coming from DOC or jail. This has now been instituted. Individuals that have been Court ordered to complete 24 hours of community service have the option of putting together a backpack for individuals who are either unhoused or being placed in Community Corrections. The backpacks have items such as blankets, towels, sheets, hangers, bus passes, a water bottle, and a gift card.

OLD BUSINESS:

Manager's Report – Kamby had nothing further to report.

There being no other business, the Chair adjourned the meeting at 3:49 p.m.
