Proposed Land Development Code Changes

Proposed Development Application Manual changes

The purpose of this study session was to provide the BOCC an opportunity to review and discuss the proposed changes before the formal amendment of the LDC and DAM. The Planning staff has reviewed the Location and Extent (L and E) provisions in the Land Development Code (LDC) and the Development Application Manual (DAM) and identified several changes that should make the L and E review process more efficient for applicants, staff, and the Planning Commission. The attached presentation highlights specific areas for which staff requests BOCC discussion and direction. However, staff encourages the BOCC to review all aspects of the proposed regulations and welcomes comments and direction on the entirety of the proposed code amendments.

A PowerPoint presentation was presented, a copy of which has been retained for the record.

The purpose of the proposed changes to the Land Development Code was presented. The changes would amend the Location and Extent process.

State statutes pertaining to the changes were reviewed. Key provisions of the Location and Extent process were presented.

Staff reviewed other counties codes pertaining to Location and Extent. Some counties have no provisions while others are more extensive.

Proposed changes were presented by staff. Staff wanted to review location and construction of public and charter schools. Other proposed changes consist of making amendments to different exemptions and

procedural changes.

Issues and concerns with proposed changes were raised by staff.

Commissioner asked about why proposed changes to schools pertain only to public and charter schools.

Commissioner asked about a process to compare previous projects.

Presentation

The purpose of this study session was to review current data with the Board of County Commissioners and request further direction on the Emergency Rental Assistance program.

A PowerPoint presentation was presented, a copy of which has been retained for the record.

Background of the county's ERA funds were reviewed. Staff was previously instructed to research eviction prevention.

Emergency Rental Assistance funds are limited with roughly \$1.5 million remaining, and the county may only expend up to roughly \$120,460.81 for administrative costs.

Staff presented their two recommendations to open the rental assistance program to serve the residents of the City of Aurora and requests additional American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocation of \$300,000.

Commissioners asked questions regarding concerns with distributing funding towards Arapahoe County residence and those in Aurora.

BOCC discussed the use of ARPA funding and ERA funding and ensuring its use in the county so it will not be returned to the federal government.

- 4-0 in favor to allocate \$300,000 of ARPA funding to administrative costs. Commissioner Campbell absent and excused.
- 4-0 in favor to allow staff flexible funding for Arapahoe County and Aurora. Commissioner Campbell absent and excused.

The meeting was adjourned.
