Program Overview

The purpose of the Arapahoe County Public Health (ACPH) Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) program is to facilitate the foundation and infrastructure for internal and external partners and the communities we serve to prepare for, respond to, and recover from the public health and medical consequences of an emergency impacting Arapahoe County.

Program Objectives

- **C:** Incorporate equity and access and functional needs into all facets of EPR routine and response and recovery efforts.
 - **O/E:** Building a department and county wide culture of public health preparedness through planning, training, exercising, and response efforts.
 - **R:** Develop a bi-directional relationship with communities within Arapahoe County to actively engage them during all phases of emergency management and to be informed about community priorities and unique needs.

 - Supplies/Operations – approximately 6%
 - Travel – approximately 7%
 - Translation and Interpretation Services – approximately 1%
 - Indirect on staff time only

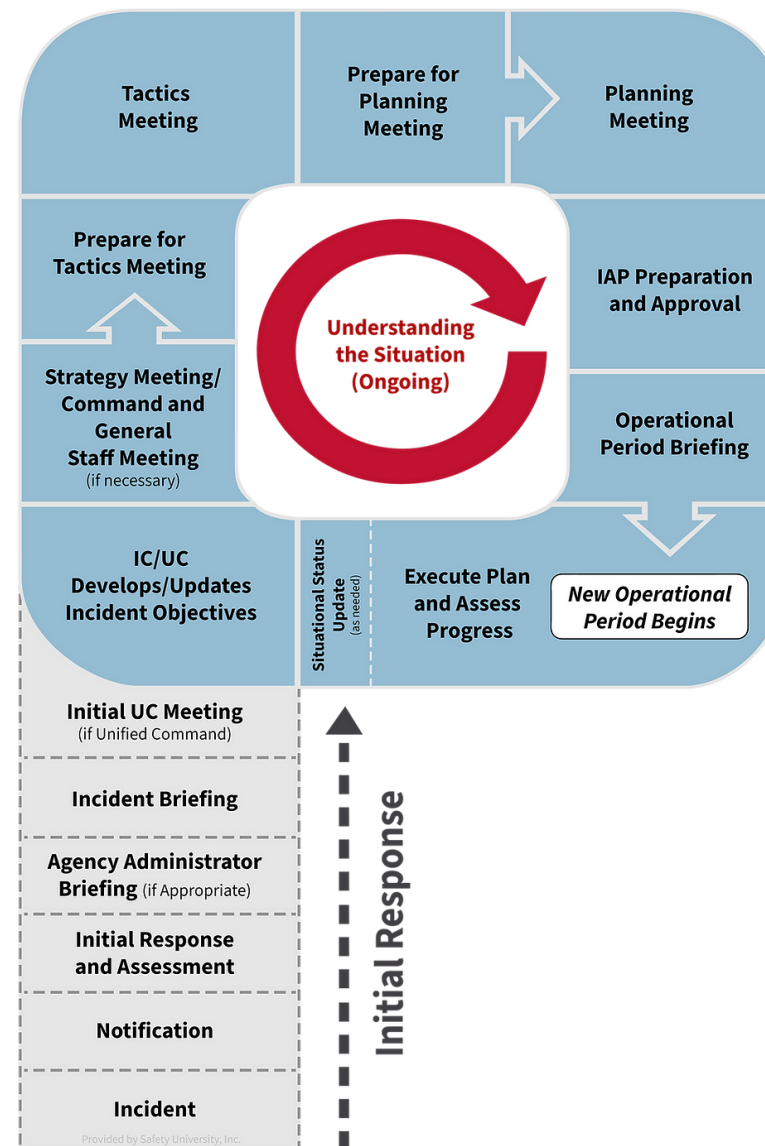
