### County Planning Assumptions

(finalized September 2021)

- Adopt the maximum amount of federally-defined revenue loss calculation available to the County to provide the Board flexibility to address general government concerns.
- Ensure County-related programs/priorities are first to be funded by ARPA dollars.
- Evaluate internal and third-party funding requests against established criteria.
- Align with recovery plan objectives and considerations.
- Prioritize investments in key areas, in alignment with stakeholder feedback.
- All investments are within eligibility criteria defined by U.S. Treasury.

## #3: 3.5 TGFP Continuation Through June 2023

- ► The Board has already approved funding through June of 2022
- Human Services staff have acknowledged a continued need for these positions
- Seeking funding to continue the positions through June of 2023
- ► ARPA Funding Request: \$254,000

# #54: Updated Postmortem Imaging Equipment

- Replace postmortem imaging equipment that would allow staff to more efficiently process the backlog created by COVID-19 pandemic
- The new equipment would reduce investigation time and staff exposure to radiation and disease
- It would also create efficiencies for future responses to mass fatalities and emergency operations
- ► ARPA Funding Request: \$475,000

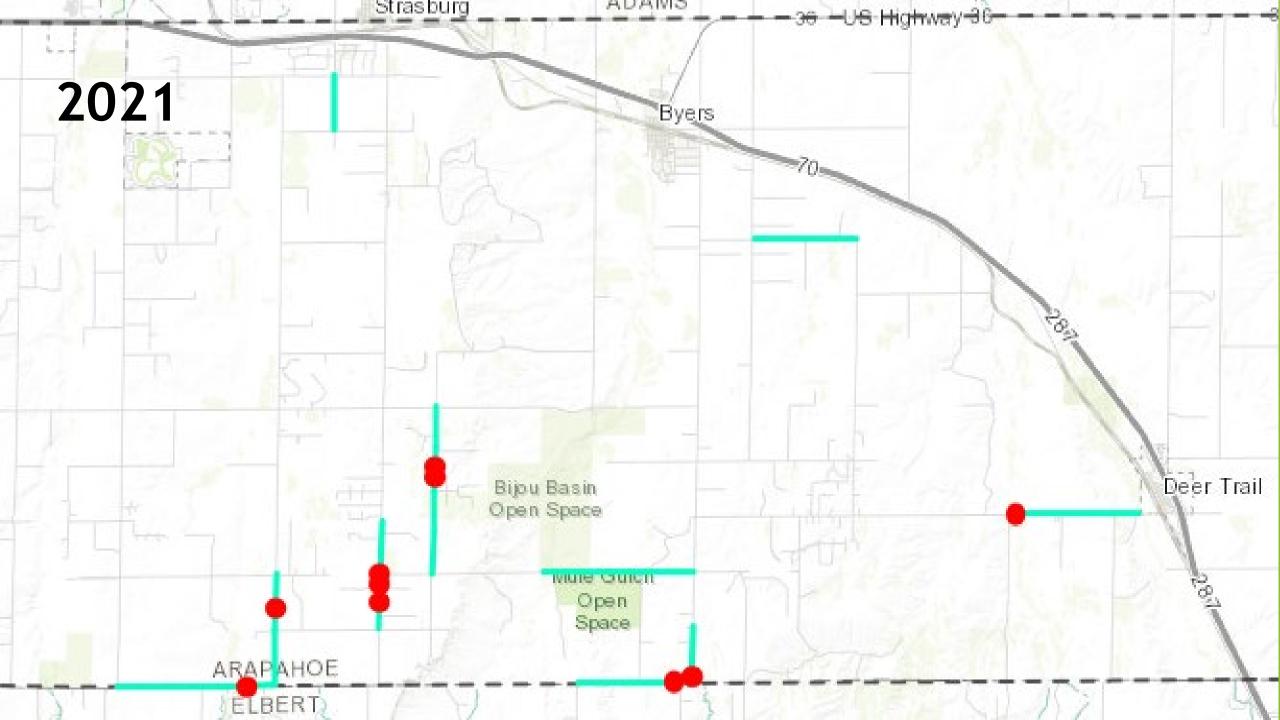
## #58: Clerk & Recorder Staff Vaccination Incentive

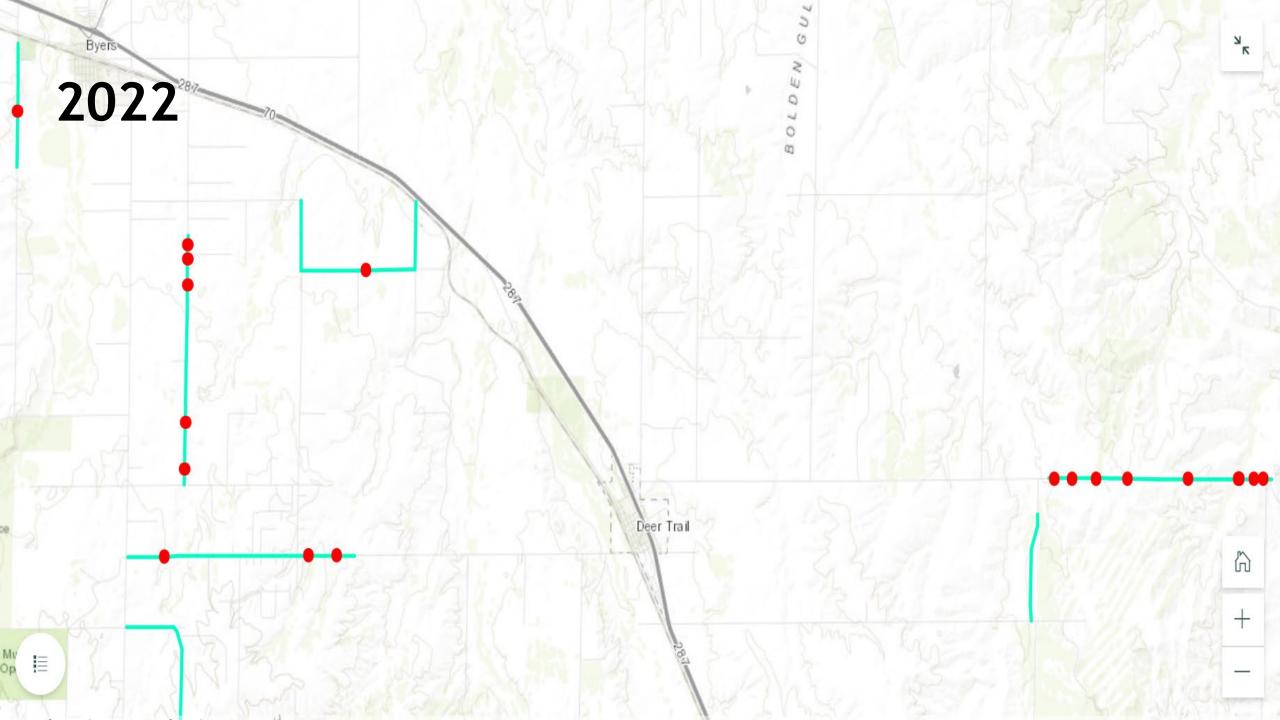
- Clerk & Recorder's Office seeking funding to provide \$100 to each employee fully vaccinated against COVID-19
- ► The intent of the incentive is to increase COVID-19 vaccination rates to create a safer workplace and potentially reduce transmission to members of the public
- ARPA Funding Request: \$13,000

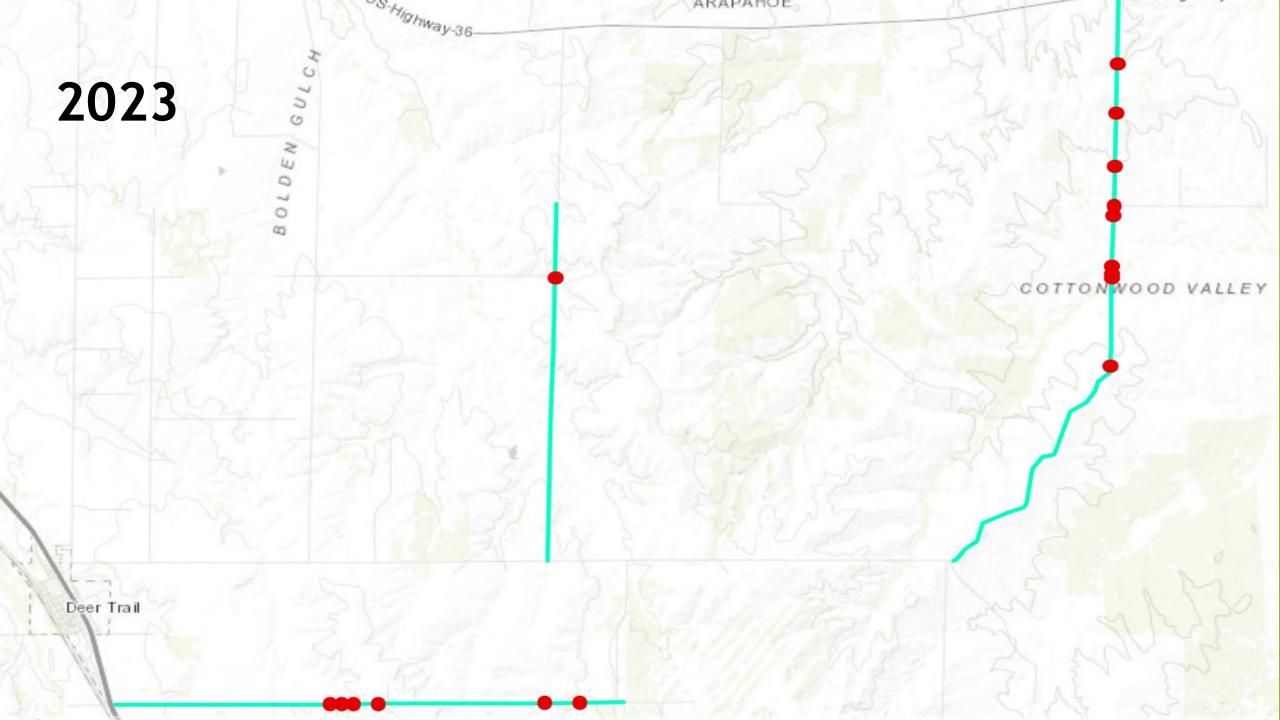
# #98: Stormwater Projects - Culvert Replacements

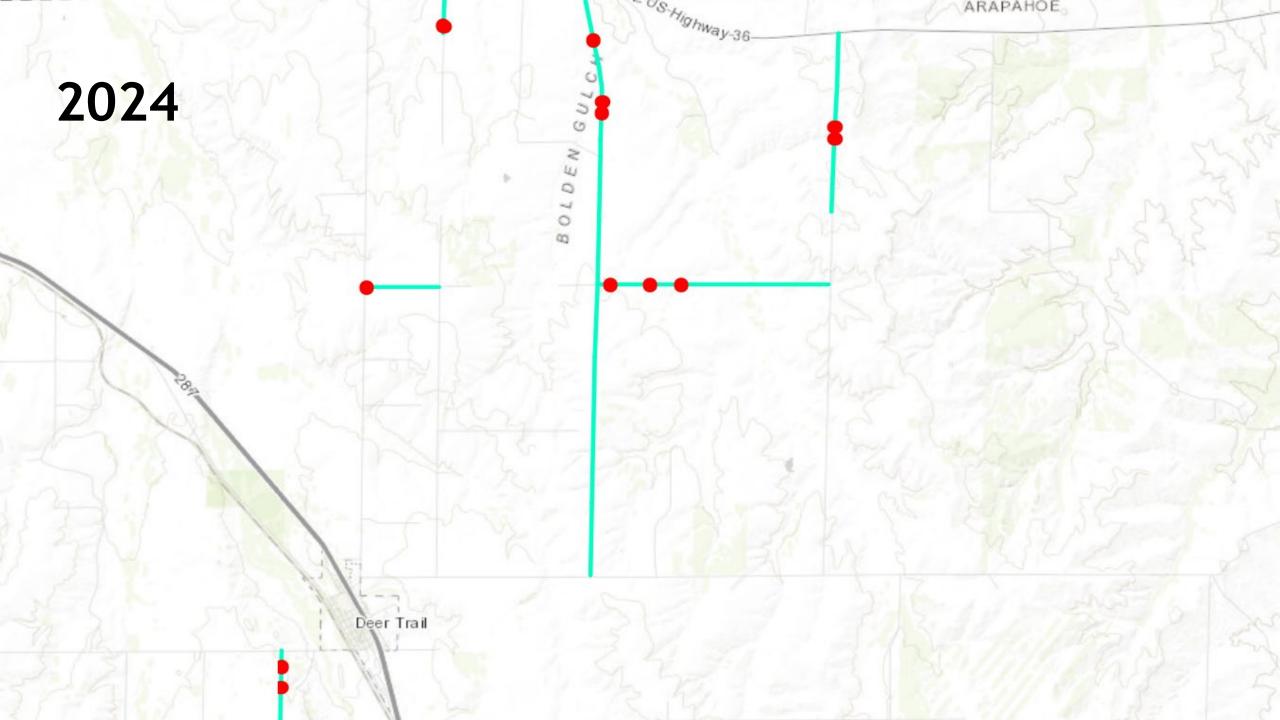
- Replace over 130 culverts in eastern Arapahoe County planned to be replaced FY21 FY24 along the following county roads

# #98: Stormwater Projects - Culvert Replacements

► They are budgeted for in the Road & Bridge fund, but using ARPA funds to cover these costs would free up the budgeted funds for other maintenance activities

ARPA Funding Request: \$1,064,884 \*

### #102: Countywide Fiber Master Plan

- Public Works & Development is seeking ARPA funds to prepare a countywide fiber master plan that would:
  - ▶ Refine Arapahoe County's role in deploying countywide fiber infrastructure
  - Outline existing conditions of internet services in the county
  - Develop a strategic approach to accomplish the fiber vision established by the county
  - Determine funding approaches for implementation
- If approved, Arapahoe County would work with municipalities within the county to seek additional funding to study their portion of the county.
- ARPA Funding Request: \$400,000 \*
