

Substance Use Services for AC residents in 2020

Substance Use Program Outcomes


 65% reported a decrease in their use of alcohol

Improved pre and post scores for:

- 1. Use (36% of clients)
- 2. Risk (52% of clients)
- 3. Protective Factors (53% of clients)







Crisis & Acute Treatment Services

ATU

233 clients from Arapahoe County

29% of all admits were AC residents

1,250 bed days

CSU

274 clients from Arapahoe County

33% of all admits were AC residents

1,216 bed days



ATU & CSU Outcomes




Follow up after discharge

Walk in Center (WIC)

856 Crisis Evaluations for AC residents

42% of all WIC clients were AC residents

Disposition from WIC

- 34% safety planning & discharge home
- 27% admit to CSU
- 10% admit to ATU
- 24% admit to inpatient hospital

+24%

increase in crisis services provided to Arapahoe County citizens with a substance use diagnosis in 2020



81% of clients who receive a crisis service would recommend **AllHealth Network** to others

What happens to AC residents when a Co-Responder is involved?

Disposition	% of referrals
Treated in place	55%
Transport to Emerg. Dept.	28%
Transport to WIC	13%
Law enforcement arrest	3%
Transport to detox	0.6%
Other	<1%

Co-Responder/WIC Program Impact

492 police drop offs to WIC instead of ED

Approx. \$2k cost savings per person

- No ambulance transport
- No fire department response
- PD quicker return to service



-\$58,413

Co-responder program operating loss between July 1-Dec 31, 2020
